Emptying water out of boats	Club Members Coaching staff - Strain injury - Back injury	Members are shown correct techniques for handling a boat that is flooded. Where possible lifting to be done in pairs. Members to check air bags and bungs prior to using boats.	Inform new members.	Trip leader - Task may be delegated	Risk assessment given to members prior to attending a session. Techniques shown to members when they join session.	13/10/22 Ongoing
Incident procedures	Club Members Coaching staff - May be injured	Stay calm but act swiftly and observe the situation. Club coaches attend courses to keep up to date with current best practice. We have an incident action plan. We have a major incident response plan. We record and report any incident to British Canoeing	Inform new members. Welfare	Club Members Coaching staff - May be injured - Hyperthermia - Hypothermia - Fatigue - Darkness - Infection	Website offers guidance to correct clothing to wear while participating in a session.
